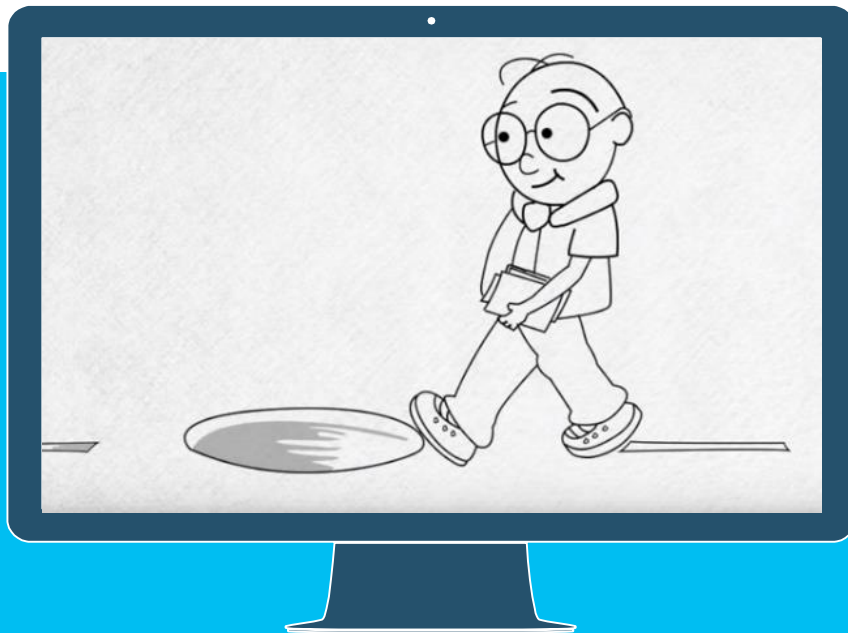

O artigo “A estrada para Emaús e a estrada para Gaza”, publicado em 1994 pelo padre canadense Thomas Rosica, de 60 anos, foi retratado pela revista *Worship*, um periódico acadêmico revisado por pares especializado em estudos sobre liturgia. Isso porque o religioso copiou trechos de seis diferentes teólogos no artigo, sem mencionar a fonte. Não foi um caso isolado. O professor de filosofia da Universidade Dominicana de Ohio Michael Dougherty analisou 30 anos de produção literária de Rosica e o acusou de plagiar trabalhos de teólogos, jornalistas e até cardeais em dezenas de palestras que proferiu e colunas publicadas na imprensa. “Nosso escrutínio mostrou que o plágio era um hábito duradouro e consistente”, escreveu Dougherty no jornal canadense *National Post*. O padre trabalhava no serviço em língua inglesa do Escritório de Imprensa do Vaticano e comandava uma emissora católica de televisão no Canadá. Ele admitiu as falhas éticas, interrompeu sua produção de textos de divulgação e renunciou ao posto de conselheiro de uma instituição de ensino superior confessional ligada à Universidade de Toronto, o University of St. Michael’s College. “Não quero que meus erros turvem a governança da universidade e ofereçam um mau exemplo para estudantes, educadores e funcionários”, explicou o religioso em uma nota. “Todos sabemos que plagiar é errado. Minhas ações nunca foram deliberadas, mas estavam erradas.”

## Abstract

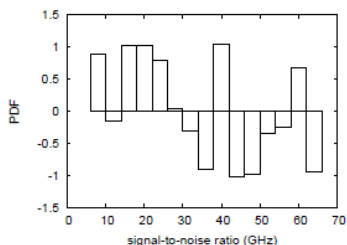


Figure 3: These results were obtained by Butler Lampson [30]; we reproduce them here for clarity.

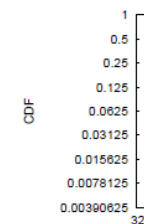


Figure 4: The 10th compared with the 0

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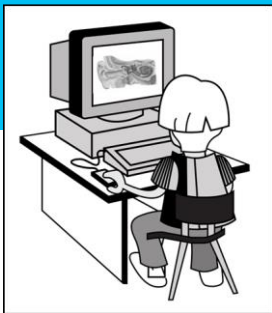

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THESE DAYS, WHENEVER A NEW scientific discovery is made, it is almost certain that it will be the subject of a paper in *Nature*. We are accustomed to seeing the name of the discoverer in the first column of the paper, and we are accustomed to seeing the name of the journal in the second column. But what if the discoverer is not the one who actually made the discovery, but the one who stole it? What if the discoverer is not the one who actually made the discovery, but the one who stole it? What if the discoverer is not the one who actually made the discovery, but the one who stole it?

Retractions in science are a fact of life. Sometimes, the published literature is wrong, and when it is discovered, the paper is often stricken from the scientific record.

We would like to believe that most retractions are due to honest errors, for example, accidentally mixing up control and experimental groups. We don't want to believe that most retractions are for nefarious reasons, like fraud.

Unfortunately, new research by François-Xavier Coudert published in the journal *Chemistry of Materials* does not reveal happy data. Dr. Coudert found 331 papers in the fields of chemistry, materials science, and chemical engineering that were retracted in 2017 and 2018. The overall retraction rate (about 3 per 10,000) is low, which is good news, but disheartening.
